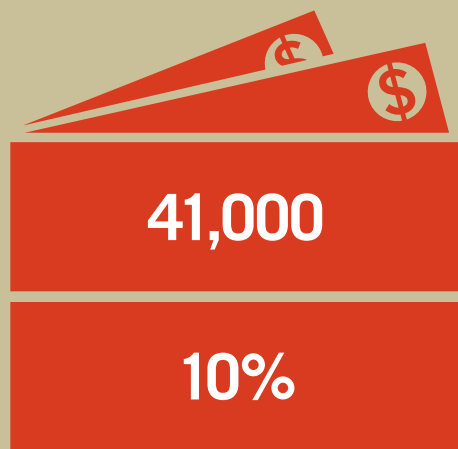


Idaho

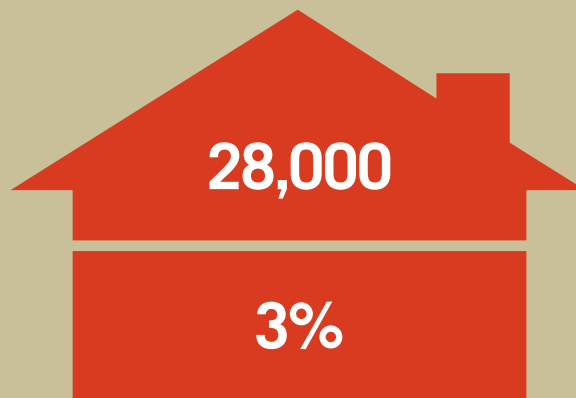
